

# **Gentle reminders**

# Wrap around care

Please note that you will need to book your children into breakfast club if you will need to drop them off prior to the gate opening at 8:45am. Parents of Year 6 pupils are able to let school know via letter/email if they give permission for their child to walk or cycle to school alone.
